Mission: Facilitate the flow of ESG information from issuers to investors to advance markets towards a more sustainable future.

Coverage: 600+ companies

History: 2014

Frequency: Updated daily, using data from annual sustainability reports

ESG frameworks/regulations: GRI, SASB, TCFD, UNGC, SFDR.

Overview of product:

This data set provides investors with standardized environmental, social and corporate governance (ESG) performance metrics for Nasdaq Nordic and Baltic listed firms. The tangible data set on the ESG profile of companies enables investors to quantitatively assess companies on topics from green house gas emissions to their water reduction policy.

Methodology:

The data is either reported directly into Nasdaq by listed companies or gathered by Nasdaq researchers from company sustainability reports. The information gathered covers metrics disclosed by issuers using the Nasdaq ESG reporting guide and ESG matrix.
